KOMODO NATIONAL PARK

See one of the 7 wonders of the world, *Varanus komodoensis*, or commonly known as Komodo Dragon, right in its natural habitat at the Komodo National Park. UNESCO has designated this national park as World Heritage Site Man and Biosphere Reserve since 1986, covering 3 islands, Komodo, Rinca and Padar. Learn more about the Komodo dragons by visiting Rinca Island, a beautiful island that will be used as an educational center which includes the Komodo Museum.

WAE REBO TOURISM VILLAGE



Want to know what it's like staying in the highest village in Indonesia? Head to Wae Rebo, a village which located at an altitude of 1,200 meters above sea level that is among the most well-preserved villages in Indonesia. It takes two hours of hiking from Denge Village, the last point of access for motorized vehicles. You can enjoy the breathtaking view as well as the warmth of the people of Wae Rebo. What's unique about Wae Rebo is that visitors can stay in one of the seven traditional houses in the village, called Mbaru Niang.



HIDDEN GEM: Lodok Lingko Cancar

Most rice fields in Indonesia implement terrace farming, but in Ruteng Cancar, you will find a unique style of rice fields called Lodok Lingko Cancar. Instead of the familiar view of sloped terraces, you will see a spider web shaped rice field which locals call Lingko, with the center called Lodok. It turns out that this rice field system symbolizes the local philosophy of togetherness.

LAKE TOBA TOURISM

Thousands of years ago, a supervolcanic volcano called Mount Toba erupted and became the natural beauty that we now know as Lake Toba. A lake so massive that it stretches across 7 districts of North Sumatra. It is the largest volcanic lake in the world that is surrounded by steep cliffs with an average height of 1,200 meters. One of the best places to appreciate the magnitude of Lake Toba is from Samosir Island which is located right in the middle of the lake.

Better yet, learn the "mangletek" tradition, which is the art of weaving mats using dry pandan leaves in Bukit Holbung Tourism Village.

Built in 1992, the Chicken Church now houses a mini exhibition of paintings of Indonesian culture and a viewing deck where you can see the amazing view of Menoreh Hill and the magnificent Borobudur Temple from a distance.

Especially in the Klipoh Tourism Village. In this village, you can learn hands-on how to make traditional pottery. If you come during the day, you can also participate in the pottery-firing process which uses dried straw.

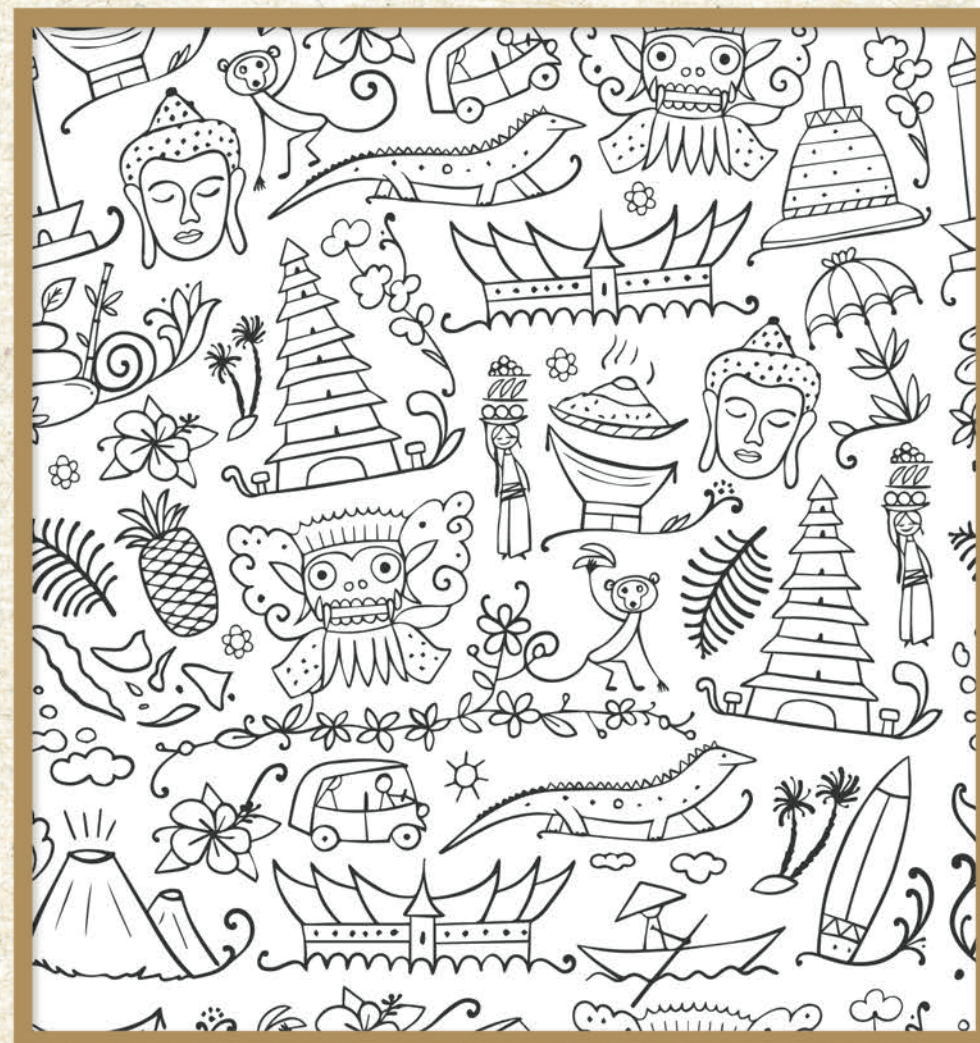
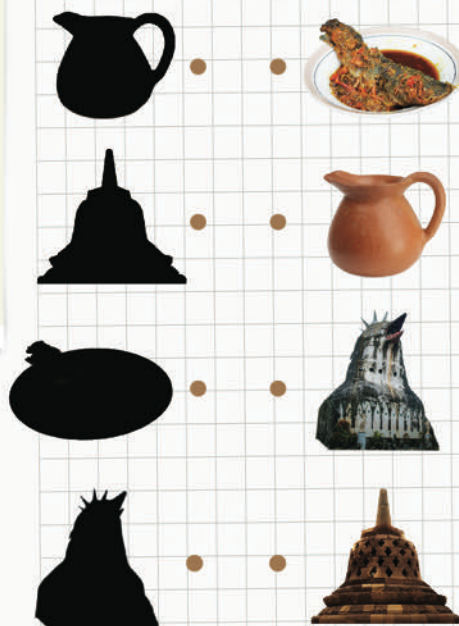
FUN FACT
