Timlo

This soothing bowl of savory soup is rich in vegetables and protein, so it will definitely calm the growling stomach. A bowl of hot Timlo soup filled with clear broth bombarded with cut chicken fried eggs , sweet boiled eggs , boiled mushrooms, various vegetables, chicken innards, and a sprinkling of crispy fried Asian onions.



Gudeg

This first Jogjakarta specialty food certainly doesn't sound familiar, right? Who doesn't know this particular Jogjafood. Gudeg is Jogja's special food made from young jackfruit cooked with coconut milk. Jogja's distinctive food has a brown color which is usually produced by teak leaves cooked together. Gudeg is usually eaten with rice and served with thick coconut milk sauce (areh), native chicken, eggs, tofu and krecek fried sambal.



Bakpia

You can find Bakpia, green bean cakes in this place. Why does the name contain numbers? That's because in 1980 a new packaging began to appear with trademarks according to house numbers, followed by other Bakpia emergencies with different trademark numbers. The house owner has a house number 25 so, that name is based on their house number. BakpiaPathok 25 has been established for 38 years. Nowadays Bakpia doesn't only sell with original taste. They are enhanced by adding many flavors such as Bakpia Cheese, Bakpia C oklat, BakpiaGreentea, Bakpia Durian and many others.

Merapi Lava Tour

On 25 October 2010 the Merapi volcano erupted lava from the southern and southeast slopes. The eruption carried millions of cubic stones and hot sand. The nearest village fell by heat material and pyroclastic flow. Nowadays, this place is used as a tourist destination. Yes, we call it the Lava tour. We will ride a jeep on Mount Merapi and visit exotic places with beautiful views, Mount Merapi, rivers. A quiet and peaceful place. You can also hear the sounds of grasshoppers, birds and blowing winds. This tour route starts from the Merapi Museum - Mass Grave - Petung Village / Mini Museum - Jambu / Alien Stone Hamlet - Sungai Kuning.



Sultan Palace

The Sultan's Palace known as The Keraton is one of the main heritage buildings in Yogyakarta where the Sultan of Yogyakarta and his family live. This palace is located in the city center and is still used for special occasions and ceremonies, especially coronation. The center of the palace is called the Kencana Ward, which is adjacent to the Prabayeksa Ward, where holy weapons are stored. Visitors can explore the interior of the palace on foot. The palace is open for visitors from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. except for Fridays and Saturdays which close at 11:00 a.m. Closed in the afternoon. Note that there are also special rules that are made to be respected when you visit The Kraton, so make sure you follow them for an unforgettable experience in Yogyakarta



Lawang Sewu

Lawangsewu which means thousand doors is a Dutch colonial building around TuguMuda. It was built as the headquarters of a local railroad company . During World War II, it was used as the headquarters of the Japanese army. The main attraction of LawangSewu is the high stained glass window. The building is currently undergoing restoration even though it is still open to the public. Tour guides are available at the entrance of the building. Although famous for being haunted because of the many executions there during World War II, LawangSewu remains one of the most famous landmarks in Semarang.



Ambarawa Train Museum

Ambarawa Railway Station was built and named the Willem I Railway Station because the Dutch King Willem I ordered its development. There are two types of trains railway running from Ambarawa. The 8.5 foot 4 foot gauge goes through Kedungjati to the northeast, and the 3 foot 6in line goes south to Yogyakarta via Magelang. Ambarawa is the link between the two regions that have different measuring sizes. In this museum you can take an old train from the city of Ambarawa to the city of Secang. At present, the Ambarawa Railway Museum maintains 21 steam locomotives, with four still in operation. Among the steam locomotives are two B25 0-4-2T B2502 / 3, from the original five fleet used by the track about 100 years ago. A B2501 is now preserved in the nearest city park



Keraton Kasunanan Surakarta

Keraton Kasunanan Surakarta is one of the historical places that was founded in 1744 by Susuhunan Pakubuwono II precisely in the village of Sala (Solo) which at that time was a small port on the banks of the Solo River. Until now, the palace complex is still functioning as the residence of the King and still carry out royal traditions. The Kasunanan Surakarta Palace is located on Jalan Sidikoro, Baluwati, Pasar Kliwon, Surakarta, Central Java. This Solo tourist attraction is open every Monday-Thursday with operational hours at 09.00-14.00 WIB, while on Saturday-Sunday it opens at 09.00-15.00 WIB and Friday is closed.

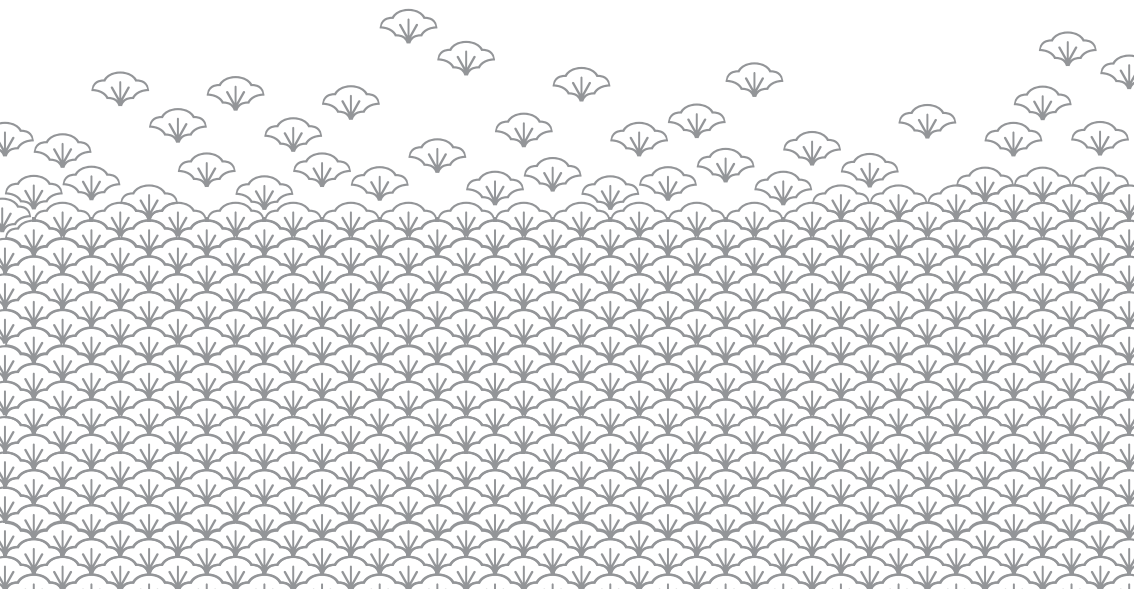


Museum of Danar Hadi Batik
